

Tier II Commissioner Report 2003 season

There was a total of eleven teams in the Tier II league, five in the North division and six in the South division. The top four teams in each division played off to see who would make it to the final. St. Albert Rams, Red Deer Renegades, Edmonton Blues, Calgary Rustlers, Okotoks Ice, Calgary Rockies were all in the Tier II playoffs. The season ended with the Sherwood Park Titans undefeated as league and Provincial Champions. The Calgary Chill gave them two terrific games in the final round. This shows a well balanced, across the province representation of teams at this level.

There were a couple of incidents that were sent onto the Discipline Committee as per the RMLL Bylaws for further investigation. This committee was headed by Mr. Earl Caron.

Suspensions were based on RMLL bylaws and regulations and where applicable the ALA bylaws. A number of fines and suspensions were handed out. One coach was fined and suspended from coaching, three teams were fined for no shows and ineligible players, 15 players were suspended and 12 fines assessed. At present the following people are suspended from play in the RMLL to further serve game suspensions or pay their fines.
