It is my view that too many times the referee wrote a report that was erroneous & did not reflect what actually happened. This issue should be addressed by the RMLL & the ALRA. Referees are the only individuals who are compensated for their efforts & as a result, should be held accountable for their actions, as well as to be congratulated for doing a difficult job. The game of lacrosse is a fast, physical, emotional game where things happen in the heat of the moment. Transgressions will occur, our responsibility as a league, is to make sure all the facts are presented correctly so that the appropriate action is taken. This can only be achieved by having all sides of the issue examined closely.
