RMLL 2013 Senior B Season Shauna Sterparn, Sr B Commissioner

Once again, the 2013 season was successful for the Sr B Division, resulting in a proud Commissioner with very little to report.

138 junior players were eligible for the Sr B draft with 74 in the north and 64 in the south. 24 players were drafted in the north and 30 drafted in the south.

The season consisted of 16 games and generally, it was very good lacrosse. Disciplinary infractions were minimal (3) in reg season and (2) in playoffs. Fighting was minimal and not of issue.

The flood in Calgary caused the cancellation of some games. As the race to the championship was tight, the Sr B division decided to reschedule the games. This meant a rescheduling of the balance of the season. The rescheduling allowed for some very important games to be held. But, there ended up being 3 forfeits near the end, although only 1 of these forfeits had effect on the standings.

There was decent competition between the teams as they competed for the provincial title and the right to represent the RMLL/ALA at the Presidents' Cup. The Rockyview Knights (1<sup>st</sup> overall) were defeated by the Edmonton Outlaws (4<sup>th</sup> overall) and the St. Albert Miners (2<sup>nd</sup> overall) were defeated by the Calgary Mountaineers (3<sup>rd</sup> overall) The provincial series between the Sr Mounties and the Edmonton Outlaws was decided with the Calgary Mountaineers representing Alberta at the Presidents' Cup in Kahnawake, Aug 26 – Sept 1.
