

## **2015 JR B Tier 1 Division Commissioner Report**

The 2015 Season was very successful for our JR B Tier 1 Division.

As most teams are getting better and the games are getting closer within there Divisions.

In 2015 we played 17 Exhibition games between the North and South Divisions to start our year.

There were 110 Regular Season games to be played.

First game was for the North Championship between Manitoba Blizzard and the Red Deer Rampage with Manitoba winning 11-7 win the North Championship

Second Game was for the South Championship between the Calgary Chill and the Saskatchewan Swat with the Calgary Chill 6-2 win to repeat as South Division
